

Um þingið í Helsinki 2012

Sú hefð hefur komist á að annað hvert ár fer fram tveggja daga þing/ráðstefna/semiar á vegum NBR í einu aðildarlandanna.

Síðasta sumar var það í Helsinki dagana 8. og 9. júní og sá SUKOL um skipulagningu og framkvæmd Þemað var : 'Innovation, Inspiration and Language Learning'. Undir því rúmast ýmislegt og oft erfitt að velja málstofur. – sjá dagskrá hér að neðan.

Aðildarfélög NBR senda ávallt fyrirlesara til að kynna það sem efst er á baugi í hverju landi fyrir sig og alltaf áhugavert að fylgjast með hvað efst er á baugi í hverju landi. Ida Semey var fulltrúi STIL og flutti erindi um *Literacy of audiovisual images in language learning* (útdráttur sem hún fór til SUKOL fylgir með)

Einnig fluttu finnskir sérfræðingar og fyrirlesarar frá ýmsum löndum áhugaverð erindi

Um 200 manns sóttu ráðstefnuna og hátt í 30 sérfræðingar fluttu erindi.

Auk fræðandi erinda og skemmtilegra kynninga eru samskipti manna á milli ekki síður mikilvægur þáttur. Pannig myndast tengsl og skilningur meðal kollega.

Til þess gefst oft gott tækifæri á þeim viðburðum sem efnt er til utan þings eins og sporvagnsferðar um Helsinki og kvöldheimsóknar í hið sögufræga Suomenlinna virki sem er á heimsminjaskrá Unesco ásamt kvöldverði þar í eyjunni.

Næsta ráðstefna fer fram í Eistslandi sumarið 2014. Þemað hefur ekki verið ákveðið ennþá, en ætti að verða ljóst þegar nær dregur sumri.
